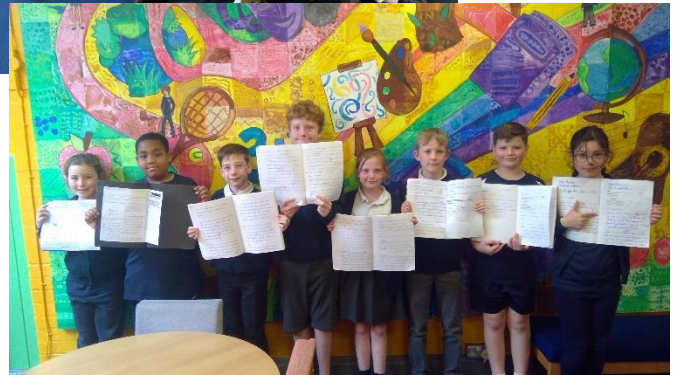

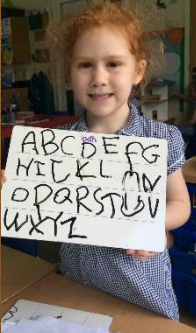


Deporestation

Living Things	Habitat	Adaptive Traits
Camel	Desert	In hot wide open to make it easier to walk in sand. It can last a week without drinking water.
Dolphin	Ocean	It has a blow hole near the top of its head so that it can breathe the water in the ocean.
Coral	Coral Reef	They can develop secondary means of movement like a foot and store in two month long in the water.
Cactus	Desert	It has spines to protect itself. It stores water in its stem.
