

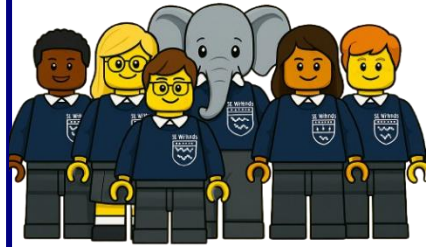
As we come to the end of our school year, we say goodbye to our amazing Year 6s as they head off to their new schools to start their new learning journeys.

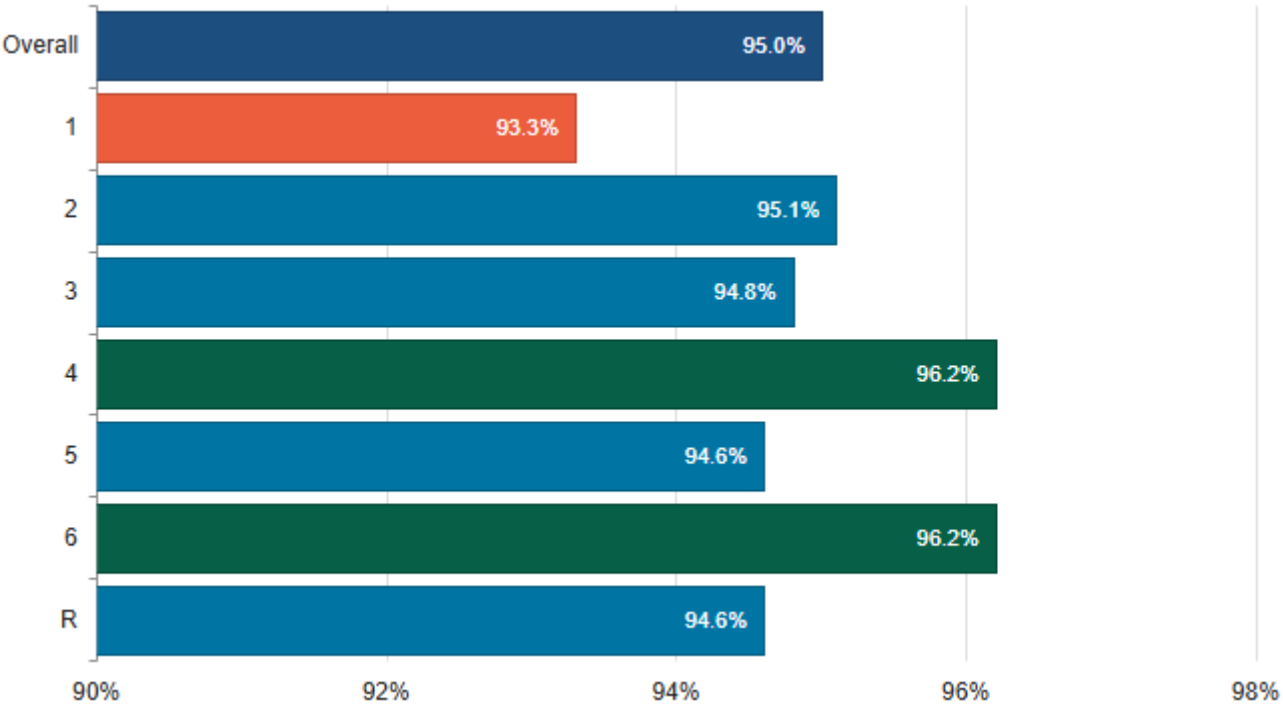




### Attendance
