
St Wilfrid's is a Church of England Voluntary Aided Primary School within the Diocese of Chichester.

Unfortunately due to Covid-19 we have been unable to run our usual open events this year but we hope our video has given you an opportunity to learn a little more about St Wilfrid's.


From the start of the Coronavirus pandemic, we have worked hard to ensure that our pupils, staff and community remain as safe as possible.


Our martlet birds are used in a different colour to support a value (for example yellow is care) and each half term we allocate a value for that term.

Our Curriculum: Inspiring young minds

St Wilfrid's offers an engaging curriculum, which links core subjects such as literacy and maths with other subjects, to provide a unified learning experience. Our teachers provide learning that is aspirational and focused on producing high-quality outcomes.

We follow the national curriculum and provide opportunities for our children to challenge themselves with our concept based curriculum. This enables children to explore big questions linking learning and giving real world meaning to what they have learnt increasing their knowledge and skills.

Our teaching staff ignite a love of learning in the children which means when they leave St Wilfrid's to go onto to secondary education they are prepared, striving to be their best wherever their aspirations take them.



Interactive classroom whiteboards enhance classroom learning and our recently refurbished computer room enables our pupils to learn valuable ICT skills.


Learning beyond the classroom

Through our teaching staff, along with a host of additional opportunities, we nurture our children's talents whether they are academic, creative, or sporting. With passionate and dedicated teachers in academic subjects and also in PE, art and music we are able to offer excellent and highly focused teaching for your child.

We are an inclusive school and value each child as an individual. If your child has special education needs or disabilities, we have a dedicated Inclusion Manager who will be happy to talk with you. Information on our SEND provision can be found on our website [here](#).

As well as expert-led opportunities to extend learning beyond the school day we offer a broad range of after-school clubs that are tailored to the needs and interests of the children. Through our wrap around care provider TreeTops, we are able to provide before and after school support along with holiday clubs.

As part of our curriculum offering, children have the opportunity to participate in many and varied educational experiences available to them. These include residential stays, field trips, special events, visits to local places of interest and our community churches etc which are woven into our learning topics.





Our Christian Distinctiveness

We are a Church of England school with close links to the three local Anglican churches in Haywards Heath, and our ethos embraces those of all faiths and none.



We have a holistic approach to our children's education nurturing their mental health and wellbeing. The children have opportunities for quiet reflection throughout the school such as our peace garden.

Forest School

In addition to our school grounds, we are fortunate to have an impressive woodland area where we run our popular Forest School which is an innovative educational approach to outdoor play and learning. Forest School encourages and inspires children through positive outdoor experiences.

Your child will have the opportunity to develop life skills through activities such as den building, foraging, bark drawings to name a few. These activities help to develop children's understanding of the environment and the world around them. By participating in engaging, motivating and achievable tasks and activities your child will grow in confidence whilst learning new skills.



The benefits of Forest School are both physical and reflective, as children are given time to explore their thoughts and feelings, which enables them to develop their understanding of their environment engaging their emotions, imagination and senses. Forest School sessions are led by teachers and we welcome parent volunteers to help with the sessions. Children wear own clothes suitable for outdoor play.

Wraparound Care



Treetops provide a fun, happy and safe place for your child whilst allowing you to start or complete your working day safe in the knowledge that your child is enjoying good quality childcare.


Focused around play your child can play freely with friends, with a wide variety of toys or through adult led daily activities.




Admissions

We hope you found our video interesting and would like to consider St Wilfrid's as a school for your child. Full details of our admission applications can be found on our website. Applications should be submitted directly to the Local Authority and a separate application form should be submitted to the school if you are applying on church grounds (further details below).

For applications submitted under criteria 3 or 4: If you wish to apply under criteria number 3 or 4, you will need to complete an additional St Wilfrid's School Supplementary information form. This form is available on our website [here](#). If you require a printed form, please contact our school office who will be able to assist you. Completed forms should be returned to the school office, together with a signed clergy or minister's letter, if applicable, by the Local Authority closing date of 15 January 2021. If you are moving into the area, a letter from your prior vicar/minister will be welcomed. Please note that applications received after the closing date are considered late and dealt with after all those received on time.

When the application process is complete the Local Authority will provide our Governing Body with a list of all applicants who have applied to our school. The Governing Body will then rank the applications in strict accordance with our Admissions policy. You must complete your application and submit it to the local authority either via www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions or by submitting a paper application form which is available on our website [here](#), or you can call 03330 142903 for a form. The deadline for all applications is 15th January 2021.
