At St Wilfrid's we have our six values of Care, Hope, Aspire, Respect, Inquire and Share. These values build on the school's vision and run through all we do at our school.

Our behaviour system seeks to recognise our children when they are demonstrating the values and they will receive a value sticker and value points to go towards the house team points.

In their house teams, as well as working to gather points for their team, they will also be learning about their person and the area of the Arts they are famous for.

However, there will be occasions when children make a mistake and aren't demonstrating the expectations we have for our children and in those cases we follow the process set out in our behaviour policy.

In some cases, where children need additional support to meet behaviour expectations, we may have to put in place a behaviour plan which will involve different approaches to the normal school behaviour policy.

This year, we have embarked on a new approach to our writing to support children in developing their writing even more than before. Alongside the other schools in our Trust, we continue to use quality texts to inspire their ideas and to model a specific genre of writing. Within a week, the children will learn different techniques so that they can produce a final piece of writing (A Star Write) at the end of the week. The teachers are using 'live' marking to give instant feedback rather than written marking in the books. We are looking forward to sharing their writing books at our upcoming parent consultations.

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Attendance


Help.
